Sermon Notes

I. Loving Jesus: Even If It Isn't Fair I Peter 3:13-22

A. Context.

- 1. The churches to whom Peter is writing are a persecuted minority with an unstable emperor, surrounded by cultic, primitive religion.
- 2. Previously in the letter, Peter instructed that servants/slaves, despite the unfairness of their situation, serve their masters in a godly manner, even if it meant unfair and harsh suffering.
- B. Now, Peter goes a step further. He suggests that not only should we be gracious when we suffer for no reason, but we should also respond with grace when we suffer directly for doing good!
 - 1. Verse 14 "Even if you should suffer for righteousness sake, you will be blessed."
 - 2. Verse 17 "For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil."
 - a. Don't assume when you or someone else endure suffering that it is because you have done something sinful.
 - b. Isn't it interesting that many claim to reject the Christian faith because "Christianity is just a crutch?"
 - 3. Completing the challenge, Peter, in verses 15 and 16, urges us in the midst of unfair treatment "to make a defense ... for the hope that is in you ... with gentleness and respect." This does not mean that we never challenge or resist, but we do so in a godly way.
 - 4. In all of these circumstances, it's not about us, but we are to "honor Christ the Lord as holy" (v. 15).

- 5. Finally, Peter, in verse 17, implies that we should not unnecessarily pursue or invite suffering for doing good, but only "if that should be God's will."
- C. An illustration from the pre-incarnate Christ in the times of Noah (vv. 15-22).
 - 1. This is a very difficult passage on which many accomplished scholars respectfully disagree.
 - 2. Wayne Grudem, in his commentary on I Peter, suggests that Peter is teaching that, in the time of Noah, Christ, in the spirit, gave opportunity for conviction of sin, but only Noah and his family responded and were saved and brought safely through the water. All of the others are now condemned and imprisoned (v. 19) in hell.
 - a. Since then, the incarnate Christ has suffered unfairly for us (v. 18 "the righteous for unrighteous") and the water of our baptism now represents and declares our rescue from condemnation and our new life through his resurrection because of our faith in the one who now has all authority (v. 22 "is at the right hand of God").
