

- A. Three approaches to preparing for final exams.
 - 1. **Partially take on the challenge.** Review a few notes, hope the questions are on the little bit you studied; but don't let the exams get in the way of everything else that you have going on.
 - 2. **Don't study at all.** "If you kept up with things the whole semester, you'll know everything!" "My grades up till now will make up for what I get on the final exam!"
 - 3. **Get to work!** Resist the temptation to play or be distracted (5:9). Keep your eye on what is to come (summer vacation!!). Know you can rest peacefully and celebrate when it is all over.
- B. Ascension Day. Jesus the Lord is glorified and returned to his place of power and authority where "to him is the dominion forever and ever" (5:11).
 - 1. 4:13 The day is coming when we will rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.
 - 2 4:14 "The Spirit of glory and of God **rests upon you**." This is the hope that keeps us going. We must nurture it in each other, keeping our eyes focused on Christ, who has come and is coming again.
 - 3. When he comes (5:10), he will "restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you."
- C. Tips on living in the interim.
 - 1. 5:6 "Humble yourself." Don't focus on yourself, but on God in Christ. It's not about you! And, ironically, "at the proper time, he will exalt you."
 - 2. 5:7 "Cast all your anxiety on him." He cares about you!
 - 3. 5:9 "Resist the devil." "He prowls around like a roaring lion" (5:8). **The devil is not a metaphor!**

"Be Not Afraid"

You shall cross the barren desert, but you shall not die of thirst.
You shall wander far in safety, though you do not know the way.
You shall speak your words in foreign lands and all will understand.
You shall see the face of God and live.

(Refrain)

Be not afraid. I go before you always. Come, follow me, and I will give you rest.

If you pass through raging waters in the sea, you shall not drown.

If you walk amid the burning flames, you shall not be harmed.

If you stand before the power of hell and death is at your side, know that I am with you through it all. (*Refrain*)
