Sermon Notes

I. A Broken Heart

Romans 9:1-5

A. The Context

- 1. Romans is written toward the end of Paul's third missionary journey when he is planning to return to Jerusalem with an offering from the churches. After that, his desire was to visit the church at Rome and possibly use it as a base for a missionary outreach to the far west (Spain) where the gospel had never been proclaimed.
- 2. The church at Rome was a vibrant one, whose establishment probably had its roots in the crowd at Pentecost rather than in one of the apostles.
- 3. There was a large Jewish community in Rome until Claudius temporarily expelled them from the city. Among those expelled were Priscilla and Aquila (Acts 18).
 - a. As the Jewish believers returned again to Rome, the composition of the church had changed. It now had a Gentile majority, creating tension and questions in the church about the nature and future of the Jewish people. This is probably what leads to Paul's words in chapters 9 through 11.
- B. The Advantage of the Jews the Presbyterians the Roman Catholics the Episcopalians the Lutherans the Christian family etc.
