Sermon Notes

I. Who's the boss?

Matthew 21:23-32

- A. Context.
 - 1. This incident takes place after the cursing of the fig tree, the triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the cleansing of the temple.
 - 2. Jesus is making it clear that he rejects the cold legalism of Israel's institutional religion, a system that ignores and despises the sinner and the outcast and has lost its thirst for God's truth.
- B. Cat and mouse.
 - 1. The leaders (chief priests and elders) come to him as though they are actually looking for an answer. Their real intention is to try to find a way to condemn him (v. 23).
 - 2. Jesus' response (vv. 24-25) is framed in a commonly approved manner of rabbinical

theological discourse, i.e. debate by counterquestion.

- 3. Because Jesus' ministry was bound up in John the Baptist's ministry, his authority was also bound up with John's authority.
- 4. The leaders are caught between what they disbelieve (they didn't believe in John's ministry) and diplomacy (they didn't want to offend the people whose support they need), so they claim ignorance (vv. 25-27). Jesus let them wallow in their deceit!
- C. The man with two sons (vv. 28-31).
 - 1. This is a simple parable to understand. The priests and elders give the correct answer.
 - 2. And in doing so, they bring condemnation upon themselves.
 - 3. Still, they "do not change their minds (repent) and believe him" (v. 32).
