Sermon Notes

I. Uncle!

Matthew 22:34-46

- A. One last time.
 - 1. The Sadducees have taken their last shot at Jesus in verses 23-33. Now, the Pharisees will try to outdo them.
 - 2. The test question is designed to bring Jesus into a discussion on comparative law. They are hoping to catch him in denouncing one of the lesser laws.
 - a. In common rabbinic discussion, it was customary to debate the relative importance of God's various commands. All of them, however, were to be observed and obeyed. This is where they hoped to trip Jesus up.
- B. Which commandment is the greatest (v. 36)?
 - 1. This was not a new question for Jesus. In another context, it prompted him to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan (see Luke 10:25ff.).

- 2. Jesus has a dual response.
 - a. The *Shema* (Deut. 6:4-9) was familiar to every faithful Jew who repeated it at least twice a day.
 - b. The second part of Jesus' response is from Leviticus 19:18.
 - c. Rather than denounce any other commandments, Jesus rightly observes that all the other commandments are founded on these imperatives which share in common the law of love.
- 3. The balanced love life.
 - a. Love the Lord your God . . . with heart, soul and mind (might).
 - b. Love yourself.
 - c. Love your neighbor.
- C. Jesus returns the challenge and tests the Pharisees.
 - 1. Knowing that they are challenging the peoples' claim that he is Messiah as well as his own claim to deity, he openly questions them on both points.
 - 2. He refers to Psalm 110:1, acknowledging the authority and inspiration of the Old Testament scriptures ("in the Spirit" v. 43).
 - a. In the Hebrew, "the Lord" is clearly God and "my Lord" refers to the Messiah, the descendant of David who will rescue Israel and bring in the kingdom of God.
 - 3. An antinomy (v. 45) Two parallel truths that comprise a seeming contradiction.
 - a. The Messiah is a son (a descendant) of David (vv. 42 & 45).
 - b. The Messiah is the Lord of David.
 - 4. They are unable and/or unwilling to give an answer (v. 46). Jesus is clearly claiming to be the answer to the antinomy. They never test him again (v. 46).
