

Sermon Notes

- I. Get Me To The Church On Time! Matthew 25:1-13
 - A. Context.
 - 1. This parable is part of a series of teachings and parables regarding the Parousia (the second coming of Christ).
 - 2. The primary theme is readiness. Previous to this parable, Jesus addresses the theme in terms of believers vs. unbelievers and faithful vs. unfaithful. Here, he contrasts the foolish and the wise.
 - B. The tradition of the bridesmaid and Palestinian weddings.
 - 1. It was a great honor to be a bridesmaid. This parable of Jesus would be a woman's worst nightmare!
 - 2. The lamps were torches soaked with a flammable oil. Not only would the foolish have to run out to get oil, but at night, there would be few dealers open . . . they really were fools!
 - 3. The wedding consisted of several processions. Not only do the fools get shut out in the end, but they fail to participate in the joys that lead to the final banquet.
 - 4. Verses 11-12 The foolishness of the other bridesmaids. Their careless and inattentive preparation, their tardiness is an insult to the dignity of the host. He would be expected to shut them out as unwelcome.
 - C. We demonstrate our readiness for the triumphant coming of Christ by our continued readiness and faithfulness in our lives each day.
 - 1. By our readiness for worship and the sacraments.
 - 2. By our faithful readiness to care for the needs of each other and to be good stewards of our own needs.

- 3. By our readiness to serve the needs of our community and world through the mission of Christ's church.
- 4. By our readiness to generously and passionately give of the first fruits of our income.
- 5. By our readiness to develop and use the spiritual gifts that God has poured out on us for the work of his kingdom.
