Sermon Notes

I. Locks and Keys

Matthew 23:1-13

- A. There are many ears to hear these words.
 - 1. The crowds and Jesus' disciples (v. 1).
 - 2. The scribes (professional theologians) and the Pharisees (religious leaders who were laypeople) who had rejected Jesus and his proclamation of the kingdom.
 - a. Includes those who are consciously hyper-critical and those who have unconsciously bought into the Pharisaic system of legal righteousness.
 - 3. The leaders and teachers of the early church at the time that Matthew wrote his gospel.
 - 4. Your pastor, your leaders, yourselves.
- B. Jesus' message is clear.
 - 1. There is respect for the role of leadership (vv. 2-3a) but as the ones who are called to guide the people into God's kingdom, they have failed miserably.
 - 2. Lessons for teachers and leaders.
 - a. Practice what you teach (v. 3).
 - b. Look for ways to unburden others, not to burden them (v. 4).
 - c. Increase in humility rather than looking for ways to exalt yourself (vv. 5-12).
 - 3. A horrid condemnation (v. 13).
 - a. The very people who have the privilege of welcoming people into the kingdom have locked people out and refused to go in themselves. "Woe to you, hypocrites!"
