Sermon Notes

I. Tiptoes!

Romans 8:12-25

A. Our realized and future hope as we live in the Spirit.

- 1. No fear of spiritual death . . . instead, the experience of "real life" with more to come (v. 13).
- 2. We are no longer slaves . . . instead, we have been adopted into a new family with full status (vv. 14-15). In the Roman Empire, adoption was an opportunity and a great honor. It could occur at any age. All previous debts and associations were canceled and those who were adopted became newly defined by their new relationship to their adopting father to whom they became full heirs.
 - a. The Spirit affirms to us that we really are God's children. Roman adoption had to be sealed by the confirmation of a witness. The Holy Spirit is our witness (v. 16).
 - b. God welcomes us to address him as "Father". We are not outsiders.
 - c. We share in all of the treasures of the household of God . . . this includes the suffering and struggles which we now endure as well as the glory of which we presently have a taste (v. 17).

B. The ramifications of our hope.

- 1. God's work in our lives is the centerpiece of what is happening in creation. In fact, all of creation "is on tiptoe" to see the emerging of God's work in us . . . it is creation's crucial drama . . . all of history finds its vital meaning in this (v. 19).
 - a. Our reluctance to see and acknowledge this is a major stumbling block in our lives and ministries . . . it is not unusual for us to think or say, "The work of God's kingdom is important, but not that vital or important."

- 2. Because of the magnificence of God's plan, we are willing, by God's grace, to endure anything in the present (v. 18).
- 3. We don't have all the details . . . our lives are often like an unfolding mystery and that means that we struggle along with all of creation in this world marked by sin (vv. 21-23) . . . like a woman in labor (v. 22).

C. Let's not forget the certainty of our hope.

- 1. We have a foretaste (v. 23), a down payment on our final redemption . . . we have already been saved by this hope (v. 24).
- 2. Hope always means waiting for something that we haven't yet received (vv. 24-25). Given that reality, let's dig in and wait with patience and perseverance (v. 25, also see Hebrews 12:1-3).
