#### **Sermon Notes**

I. Living Sacrifices Romans 12:1-8

A newspaper columnist made this observation: Every morning in Africa, a gazelle wakes up. It knows it must run faster than the fastest lion or it will be killed. Every morning, a lion wakes up. It knows it must outrun the slowest gazelle or it will starve to death. It doesn't matter whether you are a lion or a gazelle; when the sun comes up, you'd better be running."

Lots of us are sitting here today exhausted from the never-ending race that marks our lives. Many people are running and they aren't even sure why they're running. Others are running because they are trying their best to keep just a step ahead of financial failure, a family crisis or a personal problem. In most cases, we feel like the gazelle. We're running for our lives, and we're running out of breath.

- A. Key words that serve as flags or sign-posts to guide us through this passage.
- 1. "<a href="therefore" Links all that Paul has written prior to chapter 12 (theology of our</a>

salvation) and the call to action that begins in verse 1.

2. "mercies", "grace" – Indicates that we do not have the empowerment to work out our

salvation on our own, but can only proceed because of God's initiative.

a. The " $\underline{\text{mercies of God}}$ " (v. 1) empower us in our helplessness and sinfulness and

enable us to respond in ways that are "holy" and "acceptable" to God (v. 1).

b. By the "grace" given to us, we receive a measure of faith as a gift of God that is to

be used through our living, sacrificial service to him (v. 3). Through this same  $\frac{1}{2}$ 

"grace", we are given gifts to use which identify our

ministries in the one body of

Christ and characterize the spirit of our service in the body (vv. 4-8).

3. "<u>present</u>" or "<u>offer</u>" – From the Greek word *paristemi*, a technical term used in

conjunction with offering sacrifices in worship.

a. Paul now challenges the church to present our bodies i.e., our whole selves, all that

is within us, as "<u>living sacrifices</u>". Not a one-time sacrifice as was the case in temple worship, but a continuing sacrifice that is made possible by the mercies and grace of God.

4. "holy" and "acceptable" – These were also technical terms that would have been

familiar in the sacrificial worship of the temple.

a. Just as only sacrifices which were holy (set apart) and acceptable to God (see

Malachi 1 & 2) were to be offered in the temple, our living sacrifice must also, by

his mercy and grace, be holy and acceptable.

- B. Two kinds of sacrificial offerings.
  - 1. Those which led to reconciliation.
- 2. Those that celebrated reconciliation which had taken place.
- 3. These actions and celebrations comprise our "spiritual worship" (v. 1).

C. Proof in action – verse 2.

1. "Do not be conformed to the world;" "Don't let the world around you squeeze you

into its mold" - Phillips.

2. Instead, through the grace and mercy of God, "be transformed ('remolded from

within' - Phillips) by the renewal of your mind."

3. Then we can work out (discern, prove) in our lives and ministries what God's good,

acceptable and perfect will is.

a. There is a lot of trial and error involved here. There will be failure, joy, heartache and celebration and, in it all, we are enveloped in the mercies and grace of God.
