Sermon Notes

I. Get Behind Me, Satan! Matthew 16:21-28

A. A turning point.

- 1. After Peter's confession at Caesarea Philippi, Jesus begins to prepare the disciples for his death and resurrection.
- 2. Verse 21 The first of Jesus' announcements in Matthew regarding the passion.
 - a. "he must go" this is not an optional exercise.
 - 3. Verses 22-23 Peter (and the others) have no preparation for understanding the Messiah as a Suffering Servant.
 - Hebrew rabbinical literature and current teaching portrayed the Messiah as a victorious figure who would initiate the punishment and suffering of Israel's enemies.
 - b. That the Messiah would, instead, suffer death on their behalf is scandalous to them (I Corinthians 1:22-25).
 - c. Jesus' response to Peter is decisive and dramatic. He does not tell him to go away as he said to Satan in the wilderness. Instead, he says to get behind him, so he doesn't stumble over him. Thus, Peter, as he follows Jesus, will learn about the cross, but not get in Jesus' way.

B. Discipleship in the new kingdom.

- 1. "Deny themselves" (v. 24).
 - a. Not asceticism or failure to see one's worth.
 - b. We affirm our worth in Christ and submit ourselves to him and to each other for the sake of the kingdom.
- 2. "Take up their cross" (v. 24).

- a. It will involve some kind of suffering, sacrifice and abuse. The cross was not an irritation or a light form of suffering. It was a curse to the Jew and a source of shame in addition to being a cruel form of punishment.
- 3. Verses 25-26 These thoughts are repeated in various ways by Jesus throughout the gospels.
 - a. Jesus wants our lives This surrendering of our lives is the door to the kingdom.

C. A glorious hope and promise.

- 1. There will be a judgment (v. 27).
- 2. To what is Jesus referring in verse 28?
