

#### Sermon Notes

#### I. God's Pension Plan

Romans 6:12-23, The Message

- A. Sin described as a way of life "that old way of life" (vv. 12-14, 3<sup>rd</sup> sentence).
  - 1. The root of sin "you did what you felt like doing, ignoring God" (vv. 20-21, 1st sentence).
    - a. Instead of God being at the center of our lives, we become Lord. We may fit God into our agenda somewhere, but, essentially, we are in charge.
- B. Living in the freedom of God described.
  - 1. "Throw yourselves wholeheartedly and full-time remember you've been raised from the dead! into God's way of doing things" (vv. 12-14, 4th sentence).
    - a. No longer are we, or other persons or things, at the center of our lives, but God is our Lord, once and for all. "... you've started listening to a new master, one whose commands set you free to live openly in his freedom" (vv. 15-18, last sentence)!
- C. Consequences of living a life enslaved to sin.
  - 1. You lose true freedom (vv. 15-18, 3<sup>rd</sup> sentence and following).
  - 2. No legitimate reason to care about others or about God (v. 19, 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence)
  - 3. No imperative for right thinking or right living . . . or for ultimate truth (vv. 20-21, 1st sentence).
  - 4. A dead end (vv. 20-21, last sentence).
  - 5. A disastrous Pension Plan death, i.e. everlasting separation and condemnation from God (vv. 22-23, 3<sup>rd</sup> sentence).

#### D. Consequences of living a life as a slave of Christ.

- 1. True freedom never quits (vv. 15-18, 5th sentence).
- 2. The new master's commands enable us to live with a new openness (vv. 15-18, last sentence).
- 3. The new master brings healing and holiness to our broken lives (v. 19, last sentence).
- 4. A new hope . . . the anticipation that God is never done with us . . . "more and more of life on the way" (vv. 22-23, 2<sup>nd</sup> sentence)!
- 5. A fantastic Pension Plan! eternal life, i.e. real life rooted in a relationship with the Creator God in Jesus Christ (vv. 22-23, 4th sentence).

#### Romans 6:12-23 The Message (MSG)

12'14 That means you must not give sin a vote in the way you conduct your lives. Don't give it the time of day. Don't even run little errands that are connected with that old way of life. Throw yourselves wholeheartedly and full-time-remember, you've been raised from the dead!-into God's way of doing things, Sin can't tell you how to live. After all, you're not living under that old tyranny any longer. You're living in the freedom of God.

15-16, So since we're out from under the old tyranny, does that mean we can live any old way we want? Since we're free in the freedom of God, can we do anything that comes to mind? Hardly. You know well enough from your own experience that there are some acts of so-called freedom that destroy freedom. Offer yourselves to sin, for instance, and it's your last free act, But offer yourselves to the ways of God and the freedom never quits. All your lives you've let sin tell you what to do. But thank God you've started listening to a new master, one whose commands set you free to live openly in his freedom!

19 I'm using this freedom language because it's easy to picture, You can readily recall, can't you, how at one time the more you did just what you felt like doing-not caring about others, not caring about God-the worse your life became and the less freedom you had? And how much different is it now as you live in God's freedom, your lives healed and expansive in holiness?

20-21 As long as you did what you felt like doing, ignoring God, you didn't have to bother with right thinking or right living, or right anything for that matter. But do you call that a free life? What did you get out of it? Nothing you're proud of now. Where did it get you? A dead end.

22-23 But now that you've found you don't have to listen to sin tell you what to do, and have discovered the delight of

listening to God telling you, what a surprise! A whole, healed, put-together life right now, with more and more of life on the

way! Work hard for sin your whole life and your pension is death. But God's gift is real life, eternal life, delivered by Jesus, our Master.
